# SONOMA INTERNATIONAL FILM FESTIVAL ANNOUNCES SIFF WINE AWARDS WINNERS

4th Annual Event Draws Slate of More Than 45 Participating Wineries

Sonoma, CA, April 30, 2021—In celebration of its wine country roots, Sonoma International Film Festival (SIFF) held its fourth annual Wine Awards to commemorate Wine Month in Sonoma County. Ten wineries took the top prize at the SIFF | Safe Harbor Wine Storage Wine Awards, presented by San Francisco Magazine, held at the Zina Lounge at the Ledson Hotel.

This year's award highlights include: perennial winner Anaba Wines, which has won an award all four years, a tie in the Best Pinor Noir category between Bee Hunter Wines and Talisman, and a double win for En Garde which won in two of the 10 categories this year.

Led by noted sommelier, consultant and educator Christopher Sawyer, a panel of tasting experts profiled more than 90 varietal submissions, paring down the winners in 10 categories.

"The SIFF Wine Awards not only gives us a chance to highlight the premier wines and wineries our region is known for, it also allows us a platform to elevate and thank the many winery partners that SIFF showcases annually during our festival which is part of our best in film, food, wine and fun DNA," said SIFF Artistic Director Kevin W. McNeely.

"It's very impressive to see the long list of gold medal winners from this year's wine awards at the Sonoma International Film Festival," said sommelier Christopher Sawyer. "As a whole, each of these winning wines represents such a great statement about the world-class offerings crafted in Sonoma, Napa and Mendocino counties, as well as the special link between these fantastic wineries and the amazing film festival that developed this one-of-a-kind wine competition four years ago."

The video award presentation includes tasting notes from Sawyer who hosts with SIFF Co-Director Ginny Krieger, and features opening remarks from SIFF Artistic Director McNeely and presenting sponsor San Francisco Magazine Market President Walter Kupiec. The SIFF Wine Awards are part of SIFF's year-round programming which includes its annual five-day festival in March, a monthly virtual screening series, SIFF Saturdays on the last Saturday of every month; select special screenings and events throughout the year; and its upcoming SIFF Summerfest August 5-8.
