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The 26th Sonoma International Film Festival Opens with the World Premiere of JULES directed by Marc Turtletaub starring Oscar®-winner Ben Kingsley, Harriet Sansom Harris, Jane Curtin, Zoe Winters, and Jade Quon

Oscar®-Nominated Paul Mescal, Melissa Barrera and Rossy de Palma star in West Coast Premiere of Centerpiece Film CARMEN directed by Benjamin Millepied

THE EIGHT MOUNTAINS and CHEVALIER to be presented as the two Closing Night Films

Sonoma, CA March 1, 2023—More than 100 filmmakers and distinguished industry guests converge in Sonoma's Wine Country for the 26th annual Sonoma International Film Festival March 22-26.

The World Premiere opening night film on Wednesday, March 22 of Marc Turtletaub's Jules, starring Oscar®-winner Ben Kingsley, is a delightful comedy about an elderly man whose life is upended when he receives an unexpected visitor. Stars Ben Kingsley, Harriet Sansom Harris, Zoe Winters, and Jade Quon, along with director Turtletaub, are expected to attend.


The five-day festival, curated by newly appointed Artistic Director Carl Spence, along with senior programmers Amanda Salazar and Ken Jacobson, showcases 110 films, including seven films making their US premieres, in addition to multiple award-winning and critically acclaimed films. Thirty-two countries are represented in this year's lineup of 38 narrative features, 20 documentary features, and 52 short films collectively selected by the curatorial team and led by shorts programmer Oscar Arce Naranjo.

Making its West Coast premiere, the Centerpiece film is Benjamin Millepied's Carmen starring Oscar®-nominated Paul Mescal, Melissa Barrera, and Rossy de Palma on Saturday, March 25. The two Closing Night films are Chevalier (USA) starring Kelvin Harrison Jr. and directed by Steven Williams; and The Eight Mountains (Italy/Belgium), the winner of the grand jury prize at the 2022 Cannes Film Festival, from Oscar®-nominated Belgian director Felix Van Groeningen and Charlotte Vandermeersch.

"Former Artistic Director Kevin McNeely guided me with his past success at the Sonoma International Film Festival. We aimed our focus to find films from around the world that excite us and that we love," said Artistic Director Carl Spence. "In our search, we found both the awe-inspiring and sublime, as well as entertaining international box office hits, including nine extraordinary films that also happen to be making their premieres with us in Sonoma. JULES is one such film that is the perfect film to open our festival. Marc Turtletaub (Producer Little Miss Sunshine, The Farewell; Director Puzzle) has crafted a magical, crowd-pleasing film about living our best life on earth at any age. His casting and direction of Ben Kingsley, Harriet Sansom Harris, and Jane Curtin are pitch-perfect. I can't wait to see it with an audience."









Programming spotlights include films from France, Spain, and LGBTQ+ films. Cinema focused on the arts and artists, culinary, music, black, Indigenous, people of color (BIPOC), and social justice themes weave throughout the festival.

In addition to the robust lineup of films and spotlights, SIFF 2023 is host to two culinary events featuring celebrated chefs Martin Yan and Joanne Weir. The four themed parties during the festival align with special tentpole film selections including Opening Night with the film JULES (Wednesday, March 22), GAY-LA Disco Party with three films Joyland, Pornomelancholia, and Blue Jean (Thursday, March 23), ¡Viva España! Party with the film Two Many Chefs (Friday, March 24), and Centerpiece Party with the film Carmen (Saturday, March 25), The SIFF Awards Brunch is on the final day of the festival, Sunday, March 26.

"Artistic Director Carl Spence's deep festival experience and longtime relationships give the Sonoma International Film Festival access to new films, industry decision-makers, and talent. Sonoma as a destination festival also provides a welcoming and entertaining experience for filmmakers and industry guests; and festival goers are astute, enthusiastic cinephiles, and provide vital audience feedback for our visiting filmmakers," said Executive Director Ginny Krieger.

A panel for filmmakers and interested attendees, "Film Veterans Tell All," is Friday, March 24 featuring established industry guests including the new director of the Sundance Film Festival, Eugene Hernandez. On Saturday, March 25, San Francisco food and film critic Meredith Brody moderates "A Conversation about Food and Cinema" with attending culinary filmmakers. Two free film events, one for UFO enthusiasts, and the other to experience hands-on family engagement enhance the festival's offerings.


Big Giant Wave - Canada (US Premiere)
